MESSAGE FROM MICHAEL

Welcome to the Autumn edition of the Deakin Community News.

We have another big year ahead and with an election approaching, it's a good time to reflect on our local achievements in recent years as well as the exciting projects ahead.

Recently I announced that the Federal Government has commenced work on three multi-level car parks at Croydon, Ringwood and Mitcham stations.

The lack of parking at our local stations has been a source of frustration for many in our community, and with more than 1,400 new carparks at these three stations, it will make the lives of commuters just a little bit easier. As well as getting cars off our roads.

This complements other congestion busting projects like the upgrade to the Maroondah Hwy/Dorset Rd intersection, improvements to Plymouth Rd and Lincoln Rd in Croydon and a much needed upgrade to Tortice Dve in North Ringwood.

We are also continuing to invest in new local community infrastructure projects including, an upgrade to the Cheong Park sporting pavilion Clubs as well as the Ainslie Park pavilion.

This is in addition to a new state-of-the-art netball stadium at HE Parker Reserve which is nearing completion and a new two-court stadium which has just been completed at Norwood Secondary College.

Of course, these investments into our community are only possible with a strong economy and budget.

I will be asking you to continue backing my plan for our local community to keep this important work going.

THE BABES PROJECT

It was great to join the team from **The Babes Project** to announce \$240,000 of funding to support their work with women who are seeking additional support during pregnancy.

After catching up with the Babes Project team late last year, and hearing about the increasingly long wait-list for their services, I am thrilled to hear that this funding will help even more expectant mothers.

CHEONG PARK UPGRADE

Great news for South Croydon Football and South Croydon Cricket Clubs! A \$500,000 funding commitment from the Federal Government will mean that we are able to upgrade the facilities at Cheong Park.

This will include an upgrade to the women's change rooms, ensuring improved facilities for the growing number of female club players. It will also include an additional level to be added to the pavilion.





NEW CARPARKS COMING TO A TRAIN STATION NEAR YOU!

I am excited to announce that \$45 million in federal funding will be provided to build an additional 1,400+ new car-parking spaces at stations across the Deakin electorate.

Given the proximity of these stations to key local amenities, commuters, shoppers and traders frequently have to compete for the limited number of parking spaces that are currently available. These new facilities will mean an end to the parking wars once and for all!

Over the last few years, dozens of local residents have relayed to me the frustration they've felt arriving at the station bright and early, only to find that there are no spaces left.

These new facilities will finally fix this problem and help make the morning commute that little bit smoother and more bearable.

Work has commenced on more than 1400+ train station car parks.:

LOCAL PROJECTS



AINSLIE PARK PAVILION

Big news for the Ainslie Park Cricket Club and East Ringwood Junior Football Club Inc! I was happy to announce that the Federal Government would kickstart a major redevelopment of the Ainslie Park Pavilion with a \$500,000 grant. With the support of Maroondah City Council it'll be exciting to see this facility meet the needs of these outstanding local clubs.



HEATHMONT BASEBALL

Great to catch up with the Heathmont Baseball Club on the completion of a \$230,000 upgrade to the lights at Heathmont Reserve. With joint funding from the Federal Government and Maroondah City Council the improved lighting will allow training and junior matches to be played much later into the evening.



BILL WILKINS LODGE REDEVELOPMENT

It was great to officially launch the \$550,000 redevelopment of Bill Wilkins Lodge at Bedford Park in Ringwood! The new building, jointly funded with the Maroondah City Council, will continue to be home to the Maroondah Calisthenics Club, Ringwood Highland Pipe Band and Kevin Hawthorne Ninja Schools.

H.E. PARKER RESERVE NETBALL UPDATE

Construction work on our new netball and sports complex at H.E. Parker Reserve in Heathmont is progressing quickly. This stadium is set to become one of the premier sporting facilities for our local area, and is on track to be completed within the next few months.





NORWOOD SECONDARY COLLEGE BASKETBALL STADIUM

Fabulous to see the new Basketball Court at Norwood Secondary College finally completed. Thanks to \$1.6 million invested by the Federal Government. The stadium will be able to facilitate school assemblies, along with a range of other uses; and will be utilised by the Ringwood Hawks Basketball Association.



MAROONDAH HOSPITAL CAR PARK Construction is now underway for the new multistorey carpark that will see 500 new spaces at Maroondah hospital so that staff, patients and their loved ones can be sure to find a space.





WALKER PARK UPGRADE

Walker Park is finally being upgraded after 61 years. In partnership with the City of Whitehorse, a \$3 million redevelopment of the pavilion is to commence early this year and will be complete by February 2020.



NORTH RINGWOOD RESERVE SCOREBOARD

It was great to catch up with some of the players from the North Ringwood Cricket Club and the North Ringwood Junior Football Club to check out their new electronic scoreboard, partly funded by the Federal Government.

DONWOOD COMMUNITY CARE FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENT & CHRISTMAS LUNCH

Donwood Community Aged Care Facility will be receiving funding from the Federal Government to build an outdoor BBQ area, gazebo, children's playground and accessible pathways for non-ambulant people.

MAROONDAH HOSPITAL MRI

Since being granted a Medicare license for the new MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) service, made possible by a \$7.3 million investment by the Federal Government, we're pleased to announce that over 9000 locals have been provided with affordable access to the MRI. The health and wellbeing of our community is always a priority so it's fantastic to see this service being put to good use.



CROYDON TENNIS CLUB

It was great to visit the Croydon Tennis Club to announce funding for a new parent spectator area and shelter. Parents can now be more involved in their child's sport, by having an area close to their court where they can see their children compete.



BURNT BRIDGE TENNIS CLUB

The Burntbridge Tennis Club were excited to hear the news that they were receiving a \$10,000 grant to extend their 'Hot Shots' court for junior players!

BEDFORD PARK COMMUNITY GARDEN

I recently attended the Bedford Park Community Garden sustainability fair where I announced that the Federal Government and Maroondah City Council would fund the \$250,000 required for their new Community Garden. The new garden will focus on growing fruit and vegetables free for the local community and will allow the Central Ringwood Community Centre at Bedford Park to continue to run permaculture courses.





H.E. PARKER RESERVE PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT

I was proud to kick off a redevelopment of the HE Parker Reserve pavilion for the Heathmont Jets Football Netball Club and Heathmont Cricket Club with a \$500,000 grant. Thanks to the outstanding support of Maroondah City Council, we've been able to progress the redevelopment into a major upgrade for these brilliant local clubs. With work commencing shortly, this will be an outstanding facility that will serve these clubs and our community for years to come.

INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS



MAROONDAH HWY / DORSET RD UPGRADE

Having secured funding for the \$8m upgrade to Maroondah Hwy / Dorset Rd intersection, it's pleasing to see that work is still progressing on schedule. Phase 1 and 2 works are now nearing completion with works on Phase 3 now well underway. The upgrade will dramatically improve traffic flow through the intersection. During peak hour, delays will be reduced from 4 cycles of lights to just 1 cycle.

THE \$1.9M FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT **TO UPGRADE LINCOLN ROAD**

- Upgrading and widening the existing road surface;
- Including pedestrian operated lights (near Allendale Rd);
- Adding bicycle lanes;
- Surfacing missing lengths of footpaths; and
- Protecting and extending existing landscaped reserves.





FIXING TORTICE DRIVE

Upgrading Tortice Drive and Wonga Road to a fully signalled intersection. Building a roundabout at Tortice Drive and Warrandyte Road to reduce peak hour congestion and improve safety.

PLYMOUTH ROAD UPGRADE

Investing \$2.5 million to upgrade Plymouth Road to improve safety and reduce congestion. Making school drop-offs and pick-ups safer for students and parents at local schools.



OTHER MAJOR INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS INCLUDE:

- ✓ \$1.75 billion for the North East Link
- (🗸) \$5 billion for Melbourne Airport Rail (🗸) \$500 million to upgrade the Monash Freeway

DID YOU KNOW NUNAWADING

The Shire of Nunawading, contained the areas now known as Box Hill, Blackburn, Forest Hill, Mitcham, Vermont and part of Burwood/Burwood East. The name is thought to be derived from an Aboriginal word numphawading, meaning a ceremonial ground or battlefield. The area now known as Nunawading was Tunstall, and remained so until 1945.

By 1865, 1138 people lived in Nunawading between Warrigal Road and Ringwood. With the development of orcharding, floriculture and clay-based industries in the 1870s, the population increased and the 1881 census counted 1573 people in Nunawading Shire. The 2016 census shows 11,876 people now live in Nunawading.
