HE PARKER PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT

The redevelopment of the HE Parker Pavilion is well underway and set to be completed in April. HEATHERDALE TENNIS CLUB

The Heatherdale Tennis Club recently held an opening ceremony for their new outdoor viewing deck! The deck was made possible with the support of a federal government grant and it was a fabulous night to celebrate the achievements of the club.

MITCHAM BOWLING CLUB

During my visit with members of the Mitcham Bowling Club, I was happy to see work commencing on the newly surfaced green which was partly funded through a \$12,500 Stronger Communities Grant.







HEATHERDALE PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT

At the election I was proud to kick off the redevelopment of Heathmont Pavilion with a \$2 million grant which will be a new home to the Heatherdale Cricket Club, Heathmont Jets Football Club and Mitcham Eagles Junior Football Club. Since that time I am very pleased that Whitehorse City Council has also committed to co-fund the project with planning and consultation well under way.



RINGWOOD MEN'S SHED

It was great to visit the Ringwood Men's Shed to see their new equipment, funded through the Federal Government's Stronger Communities Programme.



VICTORIAN CHIN BAPTIST CHURCH

Community Safety has always been a priority of mine, so I was very pleased to support the Victorian Chin Baptist Church with a \$121,000 grant from the Safer Communities Fund. These funds will go towards security upgrades at the church.



WHITEHORSE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Whitehorse Historical Society does outstanding work for the local community and I was very pleased to support them with a small federal grant to help in their everyday office activities.

\$75 MILLION FOR NEW TRAIN STATION CARPARKS Planning is well underway with local councils and rail authorities for each of the following projects. Construction is set to commence later this year.

TORTICE DR, RINGWOOD NORTH \$600,000 has been secured to upgrade both ends of Tortice Dr. Negotiations and plans are underway with Maroondah City Council and

VicRoads to get the work started.





CANTERBURY RD ADDITIONAL LANES

\$45 million in funding has been allocated for an additional lane along Canterbury Rd in both directions between Dorset Rd and Liverpool Rd.



\$331,440 in federal funding has been secured for the upgrade of Walker Ave in Mitcham as part of the Roads to Recovery Program, in partnership with Whitehorse City Council. As the road pavement and kerb have reached the end of their useful life, this upgrade will see the road rehabilitated with drainage along the road to also be upgraded. Thank you to all the local residents that raised this important issue with me!

EAST WEST LINK

The Federal Government will fully fund the Government component and deliver East West Link Stage One. Our \$4 billion commitment for the eastern section of East West Link means NO funding is required from the Victorian Government. Our investment is about standing by Melbourne's eastern suburb commuters who want to get out of the gridlock. Only Labour stands in the way of this vital project for the eastern suburbs.



DORSET RD UPGRADE, CROYDON

\$50 million has been committed to widen roads and reconfigure turning lanes to help reduce congestion and will complement the recent \$8 million upgrade to the Dorset Rd/ Maroondah Hwy intersection.



AIRPORT RAIL LINK \$5 billion is being invested into a city changing rail link. Melbourne will finally have a rail link to the airport! Construction is expected to commence in 2022.

PLYMOUTH RD UPGRADE, CROYDON

DID YOU KNOW? MITCHAM POST OFFICE

The first Mitcham Post Office opened on 1 June, 1884, in Mitcham Railway Station.

By 1900, the post office had moved into a wooden shop three doors from McGlone Street (today, approximately 476-478 Whitehorse Road). By 1913, Mrs Bertha Markham was Postmistress.

The building at 528 Whitehorse Road was completed in 1924 and opened in 1925 as the Mitcham Post Office. The picture above was taken shortly after the opening. The Markhams lived in the double storied residence, which had its entry off Station Street, until they both passed away in 1944.

The building then became a mixed goods shop operated by Mary Millane until 1957 when the Post Master General bought the premises and re-established the Mitcham Post Office on that site.
