Recently I visited the 1st Heatherdale Scout Group to mark the completion of the renovation to their scout hall, jointly funded by the Morrison Government and Whitehorse City Council. Scouts Victoria offers so many great opportunities to our local young people and I am always pleased to support the great work they do in our local area.





Work has recently commenced on the new Croydon Station multi-level car park, fully funded by the Morrison Government. Site preparation started in October with the project expected to be completed by October 2021. Planning is also well underway for the following multi-level carparks at Ringwood, Heathmont, Heatherdale and Mitcham Train Stations.





Schools across Deakin are benefiting from the Federal Government's Local Schools Community Fund. Following a tough year for schools, it is great to see these new projects being put to good use!

With the easing of Covid restrictions local grassroots sport is making a comeback. Having kicked off the redevelopment of Walker Park with a \$400,000 grant. It is great to finally see the new home of the Mitcham Football Club, Mitcham Cricket Club and Mitcham Junior Football club in action.



I was very pleased to support the Salvation Army and their Just Brass programme, which provides free brass music lessons to children from disadvantaged schools, with a \$20,000 grant from the Federal Government, towards the purchase of reliable bus.



The upgrade of Tortice Dr/Wonga Rd is now complete with the Tortice Dr/Warryndyte intersection upgrade scheduled to commence later this year. These changes will finally see traffic flowing more freely and safely through the area.

### Vermont South Club



\$300,000 in Federal Government funding is being provided to Vermont South Club to extend and improve their facilities. Work is being progressed with Whitehorse City Council on the scope, planning and timing of the project.

#### Whitehorse Netball Association



Recently I attended the Whitehorse Netball Association market day to meet with the officials, umpires, coaches and players who make the competition happen. It was also a great opportunity to discuss the redevelopment of outdoor courts to be funded by a \$1.5 million grant from the Morrison Government.

## Cheong Park Upgrade Croydon



A \$500,000 funding commitment from the Federal Government will see the redevelopment of the Cheong Park Pavilion. In conjunction with Maroondah City Council work is progressing on the scope, planning and timing of the project.





They say a picture paints a thousand words! The before and after shots of HE Parker Pavilion certainly do. Having kicked off this project in 2016 with a \$500,000 Federal Government Grant, it is amazing to see the facility that is the new home for the Heathmont Jets Football Club, Heathmont Cricket Club and SALT - Sport and Life Training.

# Silcock Reserve Pavilion Upgrade

**DELIVERING** 

The new Silcock Pavilion is almost complete! This first-class local facility is for the Croydon Ranges Cricket Club, Croydon Ranges Football Club, Croydon Ranges All Abilities and the Croydon & District Obedience Dog Club. I was very pleased to support this project with a \$500,000 grant from the Federal Government.



Work is well underway on the upgrade of the club rooms at Vermont Reserve, which I was pleased to support with a \$250,000 grant. The Vermont Football Club, Vermont Junior Football Club, Vermont Cricket Club and Vermont Junior Cricket Club will benefit from the refurbishment of the toilets and change rooms, upgrade of the kitchen and bar, and installation of a new air-conditioner and audio sound system.

# Community Projects



Work has commenced on the upgrade of Dorset Recreation Reserve. Supported by a \$2 million investment from the Federal Government, this new facility will provide a new community hub for the Victorian Burmese Community and will also provide upgraded facilities for the Croydon City Arrows, one of the largest senior soccer clubs in the Eastern Region.



\$3 million of federal funding has been allocated to the upgrade of the Wantirna Rd / Reilly St intersection in Ringwood. With the installation of traffic lights, and widening of Wantirna Rd. Traffic flow and safety will be significantly improved at this very busy intersection. The project is set to commence mid - late 2021.



The \$2.5 million upgrade to the intersection of Plymouth Rd + Kirtain Drive will reduce congestion and improve safety for all road users. Construction is expected to commence in mid 2021.



\$2 million in Federal Funding has been secured for the redevelopment of Heatherdale Pavilion. This will finally provide the Heatherdale Cricket Club, Heatherdale Juniors Cricket Club, Heathmont Jets Junior Football Club, Donvale Crusaders JFC and Mitcham Eagles Junior Football Club a first-rate facility. Work is progressing with Whitehorse City Council on the planning and timing of the project.



Work is commencing on the redevelopment of Eastfield Park in Croydon South. I was very pleased to support this project with \$1 million in federal funding. These new facilities will be utilised by the Eastfield Cricket Club and South Croydon Junior Football Club.



Ainslie Park Cricket Club and East Ringwood Junior Football Club will have an upgraded facility thanks to a \$500,000 investment from the Federal Government, with Maroondah City Council working hard on the planning and timing of the project.

The Morrison Government is introducing a mandatory scheme for the sharing of motor vehicle service and repair information. Ultimately, these changes will establish a level playing field for small business and give motorists much better consumer choice.

## **Boosting Recycling**

The Australian and Victorian governments will co-invest \$46 million in new plastic, paper, glass and tyre recycling infrastructure for Victoria. This will help Victoria to process the 260,000 tonnes of waste plastic, paper, glass and tyres impacted by the export ban, and more.
