## Community Projects



The major development of the Dorset Recreation Reserve is nearly complete. I was proud to kick-start this project with a $\$ 2$ million grant from the former Coalition Government, which will serve our community for many years to come. This will be home to the Croydon City Soccer Club and our local Burmese community groups.


The new Heatherdale Pavilion in Mitcham is nearly finished. The pavilion will include a large multi-purpose function space, improved spectator viewing, a new kitchen, multiple change rooms and many other amenities to cater for the growing needs of the Heatherdale Cricket Club, Heathmont Jets Junior Football Club, as well as our community more broadly. I'm proud to have kick-started the project with a $\$ 2$ million grant from the former Coalition Government.


Works at the redevelopment of Cheong Park are progressing. The upgrades will improve the entire pavilion with more space, updated facilities and much needed female friendly change rooms. This will be a significant improvement to the home of South Croydon Football Club and South Croydon Cricket Club, as well as other community groups like U3A Croydon.

## Community Projects



## Ainslie Park Pavilion, Groydon

The new pavilion at Ainslie Park is complete. This is the home of the Ainslie Park Cricket Club and East Ringwood Junior Football Club which includes: multipurpose space, female friendly player change rooms, umpire change rooms, first aid room, and kitchen and kiosk. I have again enjoyed working with Maroondah City Council to deliver another important project for our community.


Prior to the election I was very proud to support Croydon Football and Netball Club and Croydon Cricket Club with the announcement of $\$ 500,000$ for new lighting at Croydon Park Oval, to be constructed by Maroondah City Council.


The redevelopment of Sportlink is starting to take shape, with work continuing thanks to some slightly better weather! The project includes a new roof over the outdoor courts, upgraded court surfaces, LED lights, and improved drainage. I was proud to kick-off this project with a $\$ 1.5$ million grant to the Whitehorse Netball Association, and it's great to be partnering with Whitehorse City Council to make it a reality.


The upgrades to the Wantirna Rd and Reilly St intersection in Ringwood are nearly complete. This upgrade is funded by a \$3m grant that I was pleased to secure for our community. The upgrades include new traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, and a dedicated right turn lane from Wantirna Rd. The project has been managed by VicRoads and we are awaiting the final minor steps for the project to be completed.

## Canberra Update

## LABOR'S 2022 FEDERAL BUDGET

In October, the Albanese Government handed down their first Budget. While we all know these are difficult times, the budget papers made clear that the Coalition's economic management put Australia in a stronger position than any major advanced economy. However, the budget papers also confirm cost-of-living, power prices, taxes, interest rates, unemployment and the deficit are all going up. Under Labor's budget the average family will be $\$ 2,000$ worse off by the end of the year. Electricity bills are also expected to go up by more than $50 \%$, despite Labor's promise that they'd go down by $\$ 275$. And even though Labor promised "cheaper mortgages", interest rates have continued to increase.


## LABOR IS DEMONSTRATING ONCE AGAIN THEY CAN'T MANAGE THE ECONOMY

A number of important local projects in our community have been cancelled, including new train station car parks at Heatherdale and Heathmont ( $\$ 34 \mathrm{~m}$ of funding cut), as well as the upgrade of Dorset Road in Croydon (\$50 million of funding cut).

I know that our community has fought hard for these and many other important local projects, and I am standing against these cuts and will continue to fight for what our community needs and deserves.


National Disability Insurance Scheme


I have outlined the need to ensure that the money spent through the National Disability Insurance Scheme is directed where it is most needed, so that we can make sure the scheme remains financially sustainable and can continue to support those that need it in the future.


In my role as Shadow Minister for Social Services, I have fought against the move by Labor to abolish the Cashless Debit Card. Labor's decision to axe the card will have devastating consequences for disadvantaged remote communities, with more alcohol and drugs flooding in.

Labor have refused to support - and cancelled - a range of local community projects. Outlined below are the Coalition projects that have been cancelled or not supported by Labor, meaning our community misses out.
