First step towards new netball stadium

The re-elected Coalition Government has reconfirmed our commitment to provide \$10.5 million for a new regional indoor netball centre at Heathmont's HE Parker Reserve.

Maroondah City Council and the Melbourne East Netball Association, ably led by President Kylie Spears (pictured), have welcomed this first step towards realising our shared vision of a quality indoor facility that will boost participation in women's sport.



EACH opens innovative development

It was an honour to help open EACH Housing's specialist disability development in Ringwood.

Supported through a Federal Government grant, the innovative new residence has six apartments designed specifically to allow people with significant physical limitations to live independently, while sharing the additional support that they each require.

Fixing Maroondah Hwy/Dorset Rd

Critical upgrades to reduce congestion at Croydon's Maroondah Hwy and Dorset Rd intersection will go ahead, thanks to an \$8 million investment from the returned Coalition Government.

Backed by the Maroondah City Council and local residents, including Cr Rob Steane and Tasa Damante (both pictured), this road project will slash travel times and improve safety.

The Government is investing \$9.3 million in local roads, including Canterbury Rd and Bedford Rd in Heathmont and Dunlavin Rd, Nunawading.

MRI facility opens

Maroondah Hospital's new MRI facility was recently opened by Kristie, the first patient to use the MRI.

The facility will also soon become the first bulk-billed MRI service in our region, with the re-elected Coalition Government providing \$6 million for an ongoing full Medicare licence.


