

I know that the lingering impacts of lockdowns this year will remain with many of us.

For many children time away from face-to-face learning at school will take time to recover from. For families, reconnecting with grandparents and other family will be a focus. 

## Community Projects





Following the recent redistribution of federal electorates in Victoria, I am happy to hear that part of Blackburn is back within the Deakin electorate. This is just in time for the completion of the upgrade to Morton Park, which I was proud to kick off in 2016 with a \$500,000 Federal Government grant. I am looking forward to enjoying this facility with Blackburn Football Club, Blackburn Cricket Club and the wider community.



Work is set to be completed in early 2022 on the Wantirna Road and Reilly Street intersection. The intersection will be made safer by installing new traffic lights to improve safety and traffic flow, providing a dedicated right turn lane into Reilly Street, and installing two signalised pedestrian crossings to help the community cross safely at the busy intersection.



The new coaches box and team shelters at Hughes Park are looking great. I am excited to have these minor upgrades completed for two excellent clubs, Croydon North-MLOC Football Netball Club and Croydon North Cricket Club.





The upgrade work will commence shortly on the Heatherdale Reserve Pavilion. Having already kick-started the project with a \$2 million commitment from the Federal Government, this is excellent news for the Heatherdale Cricket Club and Heathmont Jets Junior Football Club.





Ainslie Park is finally getting an upgrade to its pavilion. With a \$500,000 commitment to Ainslie Park Cricket Club and East Ringwood Junior Football Club from the Federal Government. The redevelopment will soon go out to tender. It includes upgrades to the change rooms with added female friendly facilities, an improved outdoor viewing area, as well as upgraded kitchen, canteen and social space.



Federal funding has been committed to upgrading the Tortice Drive and Warrandyte Road intersection and is currently in the scoping and development phase, with construction now set to commence in March 2022 and be completed by June 2022.





Work is commencing on the redevelopment of Benson Oval at Eastfield Park in Croydon South. I was very pleased to support this project with \$1 million in federal funding. These new facilities will be utilised by the Eastfield Cricket Club and South Croydon Junior Football Club.






Cheong Park, with combined Federal, State and Maroondah City Council funding, is due to commence works shortly. With upgraded change rooms, social spaces and covered outdoor viewing, this will provide South Croydon Football Club and South Croydon Cricket Club with even better facilities.



With a \$250,000 Federal Government grant to upgrade Vermont Reserve, the Vermont Football Club, Vermont Junior Football Club, Vermont Cricket Club and Vermont Junior Cricket Club will benefit from the refurbishment of the toilets and change rooms, the upgrade of the kitchen and the bar, and installation of a new air-conditioner and audio sound system.

# Community Projects





The new Silcock Reserve Pavilion is officially open. It is a first class facility and the new home for the Croydon Ranges Cricket Club, Croydon Ranges Football Club, Maroondah United Football Club, and the Croydon & District Obedience Dog Club.





With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, local grassroots sport is making a comeback. Having kicked off the redevelopment of Walker Park with a \$400,000 grant, it is great to see the new home of the Mitcham Football Club, Mitcham Cricket Club and Mitcham Junior Football club in action.





After initiating this project in 2016 with a \$500,000 Federal Government grant, it is amazing to now see the new and unrivalled home of the Heathmont Jets Football Club, Heathmont Cricket Club and SALT – Sport and Life Training.

## **Supporting Local Scouts**

As part of my commitment to improve Scout Halls in Deakin, I am proud to report the completion and progress of a number of these projects. Scouts Victoria have done a marvellous job supporting the local community throughout the pandemic and have ensured all their members stay connected. I am looking forward to inspecting all these works in person over the coming months.




Renovations are well underway at 3rd Heathmont Scouts located at HE Parker Reserve.



Earlier this year I was able to join 1st Heatherdale Scouts to mark the completion of renovations at their scout hall, which were jointly funded by the Morrison Government and Whitehorse City Council.



1st Maroondah Scouts in Ringwood North have completed renovations to their hall, which include a new accessible ramp, a major hall upgrade and new bathroom facilities.





The improvements at 1st Mooroolbark Scout Hall are now complete and include disability amenity and access, as well as new bathrooms for all the groups that use the facility.



Extensive works have been completed at the 3rd Croydon Scout Hall, including the addition of an access ramp, an accessible carpark, and a full redevelopment of the kitchen facilities.



1st Vermont Scouts have replaced flooring in their hall, upgraded external drainage that had caused damage to the original flooring, and updated the electrical switchboard thanks to funding from the Federal Government's Community Development Grant.

# Community Projects









The Dorset Recreation Reserve upgrade is well underway. Supported by a \$2 million grant from the Federal Government, the new pavilion will be a first class facility and the new home for Croydon City Soccer Club and the local Burmese Australian Community.



Work is complete on the Croydon Station multi-level carpark. With a \$15 million commitment from the Federal Government, this new facility will provide much needed additional commuter parking, improved safety and pedestrian access, and greater amenity to the area.

The Morrison Government is also providing funding for new activity centre carparks at Ringwood, Heathmont and Heatherdale Stations.

Maroondah City Council is the proponent for each of these projects and is making it a priority to ensure the carparks are designed and constructed as quickly as possible. I will continue to provide updates to the local community as more information becomes available.



I was very proud to support the redevelopment of Sportlink with a \$1.5 million grant from the Federal Government. Now in partnership with Whitehorse City Council, the Sportlink redevelopment will include a new roof over the outdoor courts, upgraded court surfaces, LED lighting, solar panels, and much more. The upgrades will allow the outdoor courts to be played during all weather conditions, and also allow for basketball to be played on two of the outdoor courts.





Communities across Victoria are set to benefit from the new Australian Indian Community Centre, supported by \$2.5 million in federal funding. This new facility will be a focal point for the community in the heart of Melbourne's east and will cement the area's reputation as a multicultural hub. I am incredibly proud to have been able to support this important initiative that will deliver for the local area.



\$300,000 in Federal Government funding is being provided to Vermont South Club to extend and improve their facilities. Work is progressing with Whitehorse City Council on the scope, planning and timing of the project.



Ringwood Saints Baseball Club is benefiting from new fencing that will improve player safety. With the support of the Federal Government, in conjunction with Maroondah City Council, the fence has been realigned, improving safety and keeping the baseballs from leaving play.



After seeing the newly upgraded lights at Gracedale Park Tennis Club in action earlier this year, it was a pleasure to officially open the site. I was proud to support this project with a small Federal Government grant.



It was good to see the new volleyball courts completed at Hughes Park. The new facilities will be used for volleyball and futsal by the Australia Chin Community.

## Supporting Local Schools and Kinders



Eastmont Pre-School in Vermont has completed upgrades that were funded by the Federal Government with an \$80,000 grant. The project included repairs to the roof, new LED lights inside the kinder, new security lights and bollards outside, new acoustic panels in the kinder room, and new outdoor play equipment.



Croydon Hills Primary School has put its \$15,000 Federal Government grant to good use during the COVID-19 period by updating the Prep courtyard.



Thanks to the Federal Government's Local Schools Community Fund, Aquinas College students will enjoy the benefit and shelter of new sunshades.



Brentwood Park Kindergarten has received \$40,509 in funding provided under the Community Development Grants Programme to create an enchanted garden play space. The garden will be engaging and interactive for the children to play and explore.



Ringwood Heights Primary School has used this difficult time during COVID-19 to undertake some minor upgrades to their netball and basketball courts, funded through the Federal Government's Local Schools Community Fund. The upgrade will be welcomed by students and it will also benefit Trinity Netball Club who use these courts for training.



The Year 7 climbing equipment project at Melba College is now complete. Supported by a Federal Government grant, this project will encourage more students to be active during break times.
